#### PREFACE.



# A Brief History of the Hempleman Family of America.


#### GEORGE HEMPLEMAN'S LINE.

George Hempleman, one of the founders of the Hempleman family of America, was born in Hessie Castle, Germany in the year 1732. He was the son of Lord Hempleman of Germany and had he staved in Germany would have taken the title of his father, but love is blind and more precious than gold or title. He had fallen in love with Margarette Duffy, she had stolen his heart and he vowed to marry her. This he could not do and live in Germany, for she was poor and a daughter of one of the peasants living on one of the farms of Lord Hempleman. He a peer, and she a peasant's daughter, they could not marry out of their station, so they planned to go to America, the land of the free. Little did they know of the hardships that were ahead of them, or perhaps their stout hearts would have failed; but this they knew not, and together ran away, or as we say today, eloped. They could get along well so long as they were on land, for they could earn their way, but when they reached the ocean another obstacle faced them. They had no money to pay for their transportation, but they arranged with a company there to carry them to America, by them agreeing to allow this company to sell them after they landed in America to the party or parties that would pay this company the price of their transportation, they to work for this party until their passage money was earned. A bargain was made with this company and they sailed for America. There were no steamers in those days and the vessels were crude and their voyage was stormy and hard, but not half so hard as when they landed, for they landed in Richmond, Va., in 1752, strangers in a strange land, and among strangers, to find that they

were to be sold like black slaves into slavery or servitude to pay for their transportation. They had not yet married, perhaps thinking not best to do so, until all things were settled here in America.

George Hempleman was sold at auction to a cotton planter in one of the Carolinas, Margarette Duffy was sold to a tobacco planter near Richmond, Va. After the sale it must have been a bitter parting to those two young people, neither knew whether they would ever see each other again, for in this strange land they knew not where they were going.

It is the understanding of the writer that their time of servitude was four years each, but before the separation, which must have been heart-rending, they agreed that after their servitude was finished they should each return to Richmond. Va., their starting place; and their meeting point was to be the Little Old St. John's church, which is an Episcopal church. the one in which Patrick Henry afterward made his famous speech before the Revolutionary war, when the leading men of Virginia met in this church and Patrick Henry made his famous speech in which he said "give me liberty or give me death;" and this so fired their hearts and upon this Virginia second from the crown, and cast her lot with the colonies. This church is still preserved on account of this event, and they yet hold services in this church. It was the good fortune of the writer, a few years ago, to visit this old church and photograph same, also the grave of the minister that afterwards married George Hempleman and Margarette Duffy after their return from servitude, and the writer is proud of the privilege of presenting to the Hempleman family a cut of this sacred little old church and grave. Also a cut of the tree at the spring where George Hempleman with his son George and family camped in 1808, the first night when they reached Clarke County, Ohio. The old elm tree is still stand-

ing and leans over the hole where once there was a famous spring.

George Hempleman fell in cruel hands and when he returned he was broken in health. Margarette Duffy was more fortunate, she fell in good hands and being used to hard work fared better. Neither heard of each other until their time of servitude had expired; but true to their promise, each started for Richmond and the little old church. Margarette Duffy being only a short distance from Richmond, reached there first, and went direct to the old St. John's church, attending every service regularly, hoping soon to see her lover return. Time wore on and she almost lost hope of ever seeing him again. Finally, one cold crispy morning as she sat watching every passer through the door, she saw a stout young German man coming through the door, pause for a moment, look around, seemingly looking for some one that he did not see, then he sat down, and drew from his hands a pair of white mittens, and laid them across his knees; immediately Margarette Duffy recognized those mittens as the ones she had knit in Germany and gave to her lover. George Time had wrought such changes in those two young folks that it was no wonder that neither knew the other, but at the close of the service, those two wanderers were reunited. What a happy reunion for them this must have been. They were married in this little old church in 1756. The grave of the minister that united these two young Germans lies at the east door of this little old church as you will see in the cut.

Soon after this they moved into Pennsylvania, and settled within three miles of Philadelphia, and the following children were born to them: Elizabeth, George, Katherine and Nancy.

When the war broke out between the Colonies and England George Hempleman cast his lot with the Colonies and enlisted in Capt. Wm. Johnson's company, fourth battalion

of the Lancaster militia in 1781. Battalion commander not stated. (Reference Effie Hempleman, Springfield, Ohio.) And at the close of the war was honorably discharged.

After the war George Hempleman and family moved to North Carolina, and from there to Hardy County, Virginia. George Hempleman, in 1805, lost his wife, and she was buried in Hardy County, Virginia. In 1808, George Hempleman in company with his son George and family and his daughter Elizabeth, who had married George Weaver, started for Ohio with two wagons. The mountain roads were rough and they had not gotten far until one of their wagons fell over the mountain side and the team was killed and wagon lost. They gathered up what they could and loaded into the other wagon and all went afoot, and somewhere on the route this wagon was also lost and had to be abandoned. The bedding and what they could gather up was strapped onto the horses and the men and children carried what they could, and in the fall of 1808 reached Clarke County, Ohio, and camped for the first night on Masses Creek, two miles south of South Charleston, Clarke County, Ohio. They camped near the old spring near the Samuel Briggs farm, made famous by the number of people that camped at that spring on their way from the East to Ohio. A cut of the old Elm tree that stood by this famous spring is shown in this pamphlet, and the tree is still standing.

Near by this spring lived Samuel Briggs. That evening, Mrs. Briggs sent her son Samuel with a bucket full of milk and some provisions to those campers. Among the children was one called Elizabeth, daughter of George Hempleman, Sc., who afterwards became the wife of this boy, Samuel Briggs, who carried the milk and provisions to them.

The Hempleman and Weaver families moved on a few miles west of South Charleston and there located on the Little Miani river. The country was then in a wilderness. Their

first shelter was poles fashioned like a roof and covered with grass, and they gathered leaves for a bed, and so lived until houses could be built.

George Hempleman, Sr., lived with his son George until he died in the year 1842, at the age of 110 years, and was buried at South Charleston, Ohio.

Of Catherine and Nancy Hempleman we have no history. The second son of George Hempleman the First and Margarette Duffy Hempleman, George Hempleman, Jr., married Eath Howell in Hardy County, Virginia, and the following children were born to them: Nancy, Elizabeth, Susan, Delila, Margarette, Henry, Daniel H., Mary Ann and Cynthia.

Ruth Howell Hempleman died in the year 1825 and was buried at Lisbon, Ohio.

George Hempleman, Jr., married for his second wife, Sarah Bilderback, in the year 1826, who died in the year 1847. To them were born two children, twins, named George F, and Sarah.

George Hempleman, the Second, died in the year 1853, and was buried at South Charleston, Ohio.

#### NANCY HEMPLEMAN'S LIFE.

Nancy Hempleman, daughter of George Hempleman the Second, was born in Virginia, 1798, and came to Ohio with her father's family and helped to endure the hardships of that memorable journey to Ohio.

Nancy Hempleman married John Briggs September 2, 1819, and moved on to a farm in the western part of Allen County Ohio, and there lived until she died in 1838, and her remains were brought back and buried at Lisbon, Clarke County, Ohio, by the side of her mother.

John Briggs, after the death of his wife, moved to south-western Missouri, and there lived with his daughter Delila until he died March 24, 1891.

To John and Nancy Hempleman Briggs were born four children, names as follows: Isaac, Lewis, George and Delila.

Isaac Briggs, son of John and Nancy Briggs, born 18—, Isaac Briggs married Melissa Harter in 18..., and lived on a farm near the old homestead. Isaac Briggs died in 18.... His wife, Melissa Harter Briggs, died in 18....

To Isaac and Melissa were born four children as follows: Amos, Jacob, Alonzo and Delila. The writer knows little of this family.

Lewis Briggs, son of John and Nancy Briggs, was born in Allen County, Ohio, 18... Lewis Briggs married Phoebe Carr. Phoebe Carr Briggs died in 18.... To them were born three sons and four daughters, as follows: John, Rheubin, Nance E., Matilda, Delila, Jane and Alonzo. Alonzo died early in life. John Briggs born in 18... now living at Elida, Ohio. John Briggs married Armeda Morman. To them were born six children: Albert, Dorsey, Missouri, Merritt, Elizabeth and Lewis.

Rheubin Briggs, son of Lewis Briggs, was born 18... and died in 18... Rheubin Briggs married Jane Gaskill; to them was born one son named Carl.

Nancy E. Briggs, daughter of Lewis Briggs born in 18..., and married A. J. Morman, June, 1861. Now resides at Delphos, Ohio. To them were born five children. Four sons and one daughter, namely: Solomon, Edward, Joseph, Oma and Raleigh.

Delila Briggs, daughter of Lewis and Phoebe Carr Briggs, born in 18... and married Abraham Peek. To them were born four children as follows: Nelson, Alanson, Carry and Abraham.

George Briggs, son of John and Nancy Briggs, born in 18... and died in 18... George Briggs married Catherine Jones in 1839, who died in 18... George Briggs died August 24, 1904.

George Briggs was one of those jolly fellows who loved to have a good time. He, like many others, offered himself to his country's cause in the dark hours of the Civil War.

To George and Catherine Briggs were born eight children, names as follows: Alonzo, Mary, Emma, Edgar, Staughton H., Elizabeth, William and Charles. Most of them are living in and about Delphos, Ohio.

Delila, daughter of John and Nancy Briggs, was born in 18..., and married William Ryan, and soon after their marriage moved to southwestern Missouri. The writer has not been able to learn very much concerning this family. It was with this daughter that John Briggs, Sr., lived the latter part of his life and until he died.

#### ELIZABETH HEMPLEMAN BRIGGS.

Elizabeth Hempleman, daughter of George Hempleman the Second and Ruth Howell Hempleman, was born in Hardin Co., Va., Oct. 8, 1803, and came to Ohio with her father, mother, two sisters, grandfather and the George Weaver family. A history of this memorable journey across the mountains has been given in this history before, and the first night they camped in Clarke County, Ohio, was under a large elm tree on the north bank of Masses creek. Near by was the home of Samuel Briggs. Mrs. Briggs, wife of Samuel Briggs, was one of those great-hearted pioneer women and when she saw this camp of movers with a lot of small children, her heart went out to them, and she sent her sons down to this camp with milk, bread and wild honey, and one of these boys named Samuel, who afterwards married for his wife Elizabeth Hempleman, one of those little girls in this camp that night, and she and her husband afterwards owned this very farm on which they camped that night, and there lived until her husband died, then she moved to South Charleston, Ohio, and

there married a man by the name of Jacob Kizer, and there lived until she died January 30, 1889. Jacob Kizer died in South Charleston, Ohio, in 1884.

Elizabeth Hempleman, daughter of George Hempleman the Second and Ruth Howell Hempleman, married Samuel Briggs May 10, 1821.

Samuel Briggs born January 18, 1787, died September 8, 1850. To them were born seven children, Lucinda, Mary Ann, Matilda, Amos, Charles, Henry and Elizabeth.

Lucinda, daughter of Samuel and Elizabeth Hempleman Briggs, was born March 24, 1822, died September 26, 1854. Lucinda Briggs married John Sulser and to them were born six children, George, Frank, Harry, Elizabeth, Angeline and Sirelda.

The writer is sorry that he has no further information regarding this family.

Mary Ann, daughter of Samuel and Elizabeth Hempleman Briggs, was born August 7, 1824, now living at Chalmers, Ind., hale and hearty. She married Martin L. Carr April 2, 1843. Separated from him in 1857. To them were born four children: Walter, John P., Samuel B., and Solomon.

Walter, son of Martin L. and Mary Ann Briggs Carr, was born February 29, 1844, a soldier from 1862 to 1865. Married Mary J. Ervin December 26, 1867, she died August 1, 1889. To this union was born four children, Charles Francis, born December 22, 1868, died September 24, 1869. William Edward, born February 11, 1872, and died June 24, 1872. Gertrude Bell, born February 11, 1875. Clay Walter, born April 5, 1880.

Walter Carr married for his second wife Asenath Mills, November 8, 1905. To them were born two children: Chester L., and Mary L.

Chester L. was born December 6, 1906.

Mary L. was born May 8, 1909.

Gertrude B., daughter of Walter and Mary Ervin Carr, married Dr. R. M. Delzell, April 10, 1899. He died May 29, 1905.

Gertrude Carr Delzell married for her second husband Dr. F. E. Lister, June 22, 1909.

Clay W., son of Walter and Mary Ervin Carr, married Clara Day, August 28, 1901. To this union were born six children, Hazel Helen, Margarett, Elma Cecil, Albert, Russell and Irwin Day.

John P. Carr, son of Martin L. and Mary Ann Briggs Carr, was born September 25, 1845, and married Isadora B. Ervin, September 7, 1871. To them were born three children, Frank M., Martha A., and Dora Bell.

Frank M., born August 20, 1872, married Lovada E. Wesner, September 26, 1897, and to them were born three children. Donald E., Dale W. and Agnes M.

Martha A., daughter of John P. and Isadora Carr, born May 29, 1874, married Charles W. Burbage, January 23, 1895. To them were born four children. William S., Florence M., Stephen C. and Roy Dean.

Dora Bell, daughter of John P. and Isadora Carr, born November 15, 1876. Married James B. Albertson, September 17, 1893. To them were born five children. Eva Bell, Hazel Marie, Gladys May, Lucile and Arminte.

Samuel B., son of Martin L. and Mary Ann Carr, born August 14, 1848. Married Elizabeth Banes in 1885. This couple seen fit to separate in 1888, and in 1892 he married Amanda Huffman.

Solomon, son of Martin L. and Mary Ann Carr, was born December 22, 1849. Married Charlotte Martin, November, 1874. To them was born one child: Lily, born June 24, 1877.

Matilda Briggs, daughter of Samuel Briggs and Elizabeth Hempleman Briggs, was born May 13, 1826. Married Clement L. Shockley.

To them were born three children: William, Elizabeth and Sarah. Sarah died early in life.

William, son of Clement L. and Matilda Briggs Shockley, was born January 15, 1847; married Jennie Huffman in 1871. Jennie Huffman Shockley died in 1907. To them were born six children, two dying in infancy. The living are Frank, Lee, Mattie and Iva.

Frank, son of William and Jennie Huffman Shockley, was born November 17, 1872; married Lillie Horney, September 17, 1902. To them were born two children, Francis and Mary.

Jennie Huffman Shockley died January 16, 1908. In February, 1909, married for his second wife Mabel Vest. To them was born one child, Eloise May.

Lee, son of William and Jennie Huffman Shockley, was born December 24, 1882. Married Mauna Straly, December 24, 1903. She was born January 4, 1882. To them were born three children:

Marshall, died aged 17 months.

Roxey, born July 20, 1909.

Beula, born September 5, 1911.

Mattie, daughter of William and Jennie Huffman Shockley, was born December 16, 1873. Married Henry Dorn, December 24, 1895. To them were born two children, Helen and Harold.

Helen, born May 21, 1899.

Harold, born October 30, 1904.

Iva, daughter of William and Jennie Huffman Shockley, was born September 3, 1888. Is now living at South Solon, Ohio, a comfort to him in his declining years.

Elizabeth, daughter of Clement and Matilda Briggs Shockley, was born March 10, 1845. She married Eli Mock, De-

cember 4, 1865. To them were born three children: Adelia, Geva and Bert.

Adelia died at the age of seven years.

Geva, daughter of Eli and Elizabeth Shockley Mack, was born November 21, 1866, and married McCellan Simmerman, September 22, 1887. To them were born five children, one dying in infancy:

Carrie, born in 1892.

Emmet, born in 1894.

Ruth, born in 1899,

Clement, born in 1900.

Bert, son of Eli and Elizabeth Shockley Mock, was born March 3, 1872, and married Daisy Allison of Springfield, Ohio, August 11, 1897. To them one child was born, Glenna Pauline, in 1901.

Amos, son of Samuel and Elizabeth Hempleman Briggs, was born February 13, 1828, and died September 9, 1901. He married Margaret Bateman, March 12, 1860. She died in 1900.

Aros and Margaret Bateman Briggs never had any family, but of the worldly possessions they had plenty, and to his friends and relatives he was very generous. He and his wife always loved to have their friends visit them.

Charles, son of Samuel and Elizabeth Hempleman Briggs, was born September 25, 1832, and died November 27, 1909. Married Sarah Woosley of Clarke County, Ohio. Sarah Woosley Briggs died in 1907. Charles Briggs, like his brother Amos, numbered his acres by the many hundreds. To Charles and Sarah Woosley Briggs were born two children: Lucinda and Frank. Both dead.

Henry, son of Samuel and Elizabeth Hempleman Briggs, died before reaching manhood.

Elizabeth, daughter of Samuel and Elizabeth Hempleman Briggs, was born November 25, 1836, and is now living near Springfield, Ohio, on one of the most beautiful farms in Clarke County. Elizabeth Briggs married Daniel McKillip.

Daniel McKillip, born August 24, 1832, and died May 12, 1904. To know Daniel McKillip and wife was to know a jolly couple, and to be entertained by he and his wife was a royal treat, for they knew how to entertain royally. He died leaving a large fortune to his wife and two daughters, Laura Bell and Emma F.

Laura Bell, daughter of Daniel and Elizabeth Briggs Mc-Killip, was born April 24, 1858. Married William H. Minter, February 3, 1876, now living near New Moorefield, Ohio, William H. Minter was born August 31, 1849, near London, Ohio. To them were born five children, Effie May, George Stinson, William Crawford, Elizabeth Briggs and Daniel Quinn.

Effic May, born April 1, 1877. Still single.

George Stinson Minter, born September 18, 1879; married Zella Byers in 1903.

William Crawford Minter was born November 25, 1885; married Daisy Trout. To them were born two children: Martin Randall and Mary Louise.

Elizabeth Briggs Minter was born April 5, 1887. Married Mark Smith, January 1, 1905.

Daniel Quinn Minter was born September 6, 1892.

Emma F., daughter of Daniel and Elizabeth Briggs Mc-Killip, was born June 17, 1859. Married John S. Swaidner, March 23, 1882. John S. Swaidner was born in 1856, now living near Springfield, Ohio. To them were born three children.

Daniel Briggs Swaidner was born July 20, 1888, died December 31, 1888.

Emma Laura Swaidner was born August 16, 1890; married Elliot Goodfellow, June 18, 1910. Lives near Springfield, Ohio.

Jessie B. Swaidner was born February 5, 1895, living with her parents.

#### SUSAN HEMPLEMAN ALEXANDER.

Susan Hempleman, daughter of George Hempleman the Seeond and Ruth Howell Hempleman, was born in Va., Jan. 28, 1806, and died at Boswell, Ind., June 4, 1884. Married Richard Alexander, September 18, 1823. He died April 18, 1852. To them were born twelve children:

Julia Ann, born September 24, 1824, died November 3, 1848. Isaac Howell, son of Richard and Susan Hempleman Alexander, was born December 15, 1826, died October 10, 1894. Unable to get further information regards this family.

George H., son of Richard and Susan Hempleman Alexander, was born July 9, 1830, died October 19, 1894. Married to Margaret Lowe, February 21, 1850. She was born December 13, 1833. To them were born ten children: seven are living and three dead.

Florence E., daughter of George H. and Margarett Lowe Mexander, was born June 2, 1856, married John Miles, June 6, 1871. Later was married to W. W. Batterall.

Ida, daughter of George H. and Margarett Lowe Alexander, was born July 10, 1858, and married Silas Zinkle in 1874.

Susan E., daughter of George H. and Margarett Lowe Alexander, was born August 13, 1860, married Thos. Breaks, January 3, 1878, later married to John Zimmerman.

Lewis W., son of George H. and Margarett Lowe Alexander, was born March 22, 1862.

Willam, son of George H. and Margarett Lowe Alexander, was born April 14, 1865.

Carrie Mabel, daughter of George H, and Margarett Lowe Alexander, was born February 10, 1869, married to A, T, Killison, in 1889.

Bessie, daughter of George H, and Margarett Lowe Alexander, was born February 20, 1877, and married Adam W, Faust, February 12, 1896.

Margarett Jane, daughter of Richard and Susan Hempleman Alexander, was born November 14, 1832, died in June, 1880. Married John Tomlinson, and to them were born four children, of whom the writer has no further information.

Francis A., daughter of Richard and Susan Hempleman Alexander, was born November 23, 1834, died September 7, 1836.

Joseph H., son of Richard and Susan Hempleman Alexander, was born June 6, 1837. Was drowned August 22, 1863.

Mary Elizabeth, daughter of Richard and Susan Hempleman Alexander, was born in May, 1839 and died February 28, 1840.

Cynthia Ann, daughter of Richard and Susan Hampleman Alexander, was born August 16, 1841, and died August 18, 1802. Married Robert Cheney in 1865. To them were born five children:

Arthur, son of Robert and Cynthia Alexander Cheney, was born September 27, 1866, died October 16, 1905. Married Irene Brigman, December 30, 1891.

Ida F., daughter of Robert and Cynthia Alexander Cheney, was born June 30, 1869, living now in Boswell, Ind. Married W. E. Eldridge, June 17, 1892. He died in February, 1911. To them were born four children.

Beeca E., born June 22, 1893.

F. Earl, born September 4, 1895.

Davis F., born November 21, 1898.

Helen F., born August 13, 1908.

Lillian, daughter of Robert and Cynthia Alexander Cheney, was born February 22, 1871. Married Benj, Hammer, October 16, 1902.

Luther R., son of Robert and Cynthia Alexander Cheney, was born February 26, 1873.

Lutie M., daughter of Robert and Cynthia Alexander Cheney, was born June 20, 1880, and married C. C. Hartle, May 27, 1898.

John Riley, son of Richard and Susan Hempleman Alexander, was born August 7, 1846, lives near Berryton, Kansas, Married Adelia D. Hixson in 1865. She only lived a few months. He moved to Kansas in 1870 and married Lizzie Coblentz in 1873. To them were born two children.

Nellie G., daughter of John R. and Lizzie Coblentz Alexander, was born July 7, 1874, died October 17, 1894.

Wesley J., son of John R. and Lizzic Coblentz Alexander, was born November 23, 1876. Married Nannie Kirkham in 1903. To them were born two children, John H. and Wallace.

Daniel D., son of Richard and Susan Hempleman Alexander, was born May 10, 1846, and died June 22, 1885. This is all the history the writer has of him.

Richard Wesley, son of Richard and Susan Hempleman Alexander, was born May 28, 1850, died March 27, 1909. He was married to Emma E. Barber, February 27, 1879. She was born in Fountain County, Indiana, February 27, 1857. To this union were born four sons. They, with their mother are now living near Mt. Vernon, Illinois.

Pearl, son of Richard Wesley and Emma Barber Alexander, was born October 28, 1881, died May 9, 1886.

Alva Clayton, son of Richard Wesley and Emma Barber Alexander, was born May 24, 1887.

Clyde B., son of Richard Wesley and Emma Barber Alexander, was born April 6, 1889.

Beula Gladys, daughter of Richard Wesley and Emma Barber Mexander, was born December 28, 1895.

This is all the history the writer could get of Susan Hempleman Alexander's family up to the time of going to press.

#### DELILA HEMPLEMAN HUFFMAN.



They afterwards moved to Darke County, Ohio, and there lived until she died, January 21, 1888.

Mary Ann Hempleman Whiteley bore all the strong traits of the Hempleman family, loved and respected by all those who knew her. She was kind to every one, stage, station or age made no difference to her. Every person was made welcome that entered her home, and many were the bountiful repast that were served by her to her friends. She was a true christian, a true and loving wife and a devoted mother, kind to a fault but stern in her decision when she knew she was right. Her greatest aim and desire was to see her children be manly men and womenly women, and the writer believes that her greatest desire was fulfilled.

Joseph Whiteley was born January 18, 1818, on the farm six miles east of Springfield, Clarke County, Ohio, and after his marriage moved on to the same farm on which he was born, and there lived for many years until he moved to Darke County, Ohio. After the death of his wife he lived with his daughter, Mrs. Nancy J. Naugle, until his death, January 30, 1902. Joseph Whiteley was a man of good judgment and the people of his township elected him justice of the peace and he held this office for 12 years. During the Civil war he took great interest in his country's affairs, looking after the widows and orphans, made so by the cruel war. He went several

times to the front to look after the needs of the soldiers, and was always ready with his time and money to help them, for in this war he had two sons, Clay and Clark. Twice during that war he went to the front to look after the soldiers of Clarke County. On one of these occasions he brought back his nephew John Whiteley, who had typhoid fever. Many were the soldiers that received assistance through him.

Euth, daughter of Joseph and Mary Ann Hempleman Whiteley, was born April 21, 1842, died October 2, 1849.

Clack, son of Joseph and Mary Ann Hempleman Whiteley, was born in Clarke County, Ohio, August 14, 1843. carly life was spent on the farm, and when the Civil War broke out he had great desire to go to war, and when he reached 17 years of age he enlisted in the 44th Ohio regiment, afterward veteran to the 8th Ohio cavalry. At the siege of Knoxville he was wounded defending old Fort Saunders, after this they were transferred to the army of the Potomac. Many were the fights they had with Mosby and his men. He was once taken prisoner but escaped from his captors in the night when his guards were asleep. After the war closed he was honorably discharged, and returned to the farm, and in . . . . he married Ellen Kirkham and moved onto their farm seven miles east of Springfield, Ohio, and there lived until he died, October 4, 1890, from the wound he received during the To them were born one child named Florence. Civil War.

Florence, daughter of Clark and Ellen Kirkham Whiteley, was born.....now living at home with her mother near Springfield, Ohio.

Clay, son of Joseph and Mary Ann Hempleman Whiteley, was born in Clarke County, Ohio, December 25, 1844. He

married Mary M. Stipes, December 25, 1871, to them no children were ever born.

While he was born on the farm, his inclinations were for a more strenuous life, and so he prepared himself by going to school, and afterward by teaching, and at the age of 17, he like his brother Clark, offered his services to his country and enlisted in 152d Ohio regiment and was sent to the Army of the Potomac, and joined Gen. Hunter's army, and endured the trials and hardships of historic Hunter raid. It was on this raid that he was often for days without rations. At the close of the service he was honorably discharged and connected himself immediately with the firm of Whiteley, Fassler & Kelly, in various capacities, including the management of their eastern branch house and their foreign trade.

In 1888 he left the firm and he, with his brother George, opened up a wholesale implement house in Indianapolis, Ind. In 1896 they closed out their business and bought the Leader Oil Refinery at Washington, Pa., manufacturing oil from crude petroleum. In 1901 they disposed of their factory to the Standard Oil Company. In 1902 he, and his brother George, built the plant of the City Ice and Cold Storage Co. at Muncie, Ind., which they are still operating.

In 1908 Clay Whiteley was sent to Paris, France, as a delegate to the World's Refrigerating convention. He at present is one of the trustees of the Commercial club of Muncie, Ind., also director of the Y. M. C. A. He was for years engaged with Whiteley, Fassler & Kelley in the harvesting machine business, later became manager of the Western States for D. M. Osborn & Co. Later, he and his brother Clay entered the jobbing business at Indianapolis, Ind. In 1901 he and his brother Clay built the plant of the City Ice and Cold Storage Co., at Muncie, Ind., which they own and operate at the present time, and he is now living in Muncie, Ind.

They, like their brother George, started on that journey with two horses and a wagon, but in those days of travel, across the Blue Ridge mountains it was almost an impossibility with an empty wagon, and they, like their brother had to abandon the wagon somewhere in the mountains, and load all their possessions on the two horses, and the family traveling on foot to Clarke County, Ohio, and late in the fall they settled on a farm west of South Charleston, Ohio. It being late in the fall, no houses were obtainable, and they were compelled to live in an open camo for want of better shelter, there being plenty of timber in those days, they had no trouble in keeping warm, by burning large heaps of logs, and by these log heaps they did all their cooking. They lived in Clarke County, about ten years, in 1817 or 1818 they moved into Madison County, Ohio, and engaged in farming and the raising of stock. They were prosperous and accumulated a large fortune for those days, leaving about three thousand acres of land to their children when they died.






# A Brief History of Adam Hempleman.

Then in the winter of 1795 and 1796 he moved to Adams County, Ohio, purchased and moved on a farm two miles east of West Union, the county seat of Adams County, Ohio, where two more children were born to them, Sophia and Ann. Here their family grew to man and womanhood and from whence all of them were married.

Adam and George Hempleman for many years never heard from each other; George having left Philadelphia and gone to North Carolina and then to Virginia and finally moved near Charleston, Clarke County, Ohio, and by chance a neighbor of Adam Hempleman was travelling north and stopped with George Hempleman, Jr., over night, remarked that there was a man in his county by the name of Hempleman that resembled him very much and later George Hempleman, Sr., in company with his son George, visited Adam Hempleman at his home in Adams County. What a reunion that must have been.

Adam Hempleman died at West Union, Ohio, in 1825, at the ripe old age of 95.

Eli, Isaac, Amos, Aaron, Rebecca and Moses. Among these were some who were celebrated for their educational qualities. Aaron, whose mathematical qualifications and familiarity with astronomy enabled him to make all the calculations and constructions of an almanac. Moses occupied positions of honor and trust in the government and was for many years commander of Bologna Arsenal in Virginia, and held this position until the time of his death.

Anna Belle, daughter of A. George and Anna Liza Hilling Hempleman, was born March 23, 1857, died January 16, 1860.



Isaac Hempleman in his vounger days became interested in the manner of transporting sheep and cattle to the eastern markets and this had a fascination for Isaac L., and in his twenty-first year engaged himself to drive a herd of sheep over the mountains, on foot, to Philadelphia, and in this way employed himself for a number of trips. Although, now well advanced in years, being in his 88th year, he is hale and hearty, and makes trips on the cars alone, and gives promise of filling out the 100 years, as some of his ancestors have done.
